

## **August 2004 Officer E. Cross**

Officer E. Cross has been selected as the Officer of the Month for August. He had an excellent month in August, which consisted of 15 total arrests with 11 being self-initiated. He made 3 arrests for Grand Theft Auto, 2 arrests for stolen tags, and 3 juvenile arrests for first degree burglary which involved a detailed investigation and in which all of the stolen property was recovered.

In addition, Officer Cross made 14 misdemeanor clearances, 2 felony clearances and wrote 40 citations and 11 FIR's.

## **May 2004 Officer E. Cross**

Officer E. Cross was chosen as the officer of the month for May 2004. Officer Cross made 13 arrests for the month, with 7 being self-initiated. In addition, he wrote 90 state citations, 6 warnings, 6 FIR's and 2 SERO's. Officer Cross apprehended one of the suspects responsible for the shooting at Randallstown High School. He also made several arrests of suspects who put his life in danger by trying to elude the police.

## **December 2003 Officer Cross**

Officer Cross made 14 arrests of which 9 were self-initiated, wrote 22 citations, 23 Warnings, and 4 FIR's.

In one day during this month, he made 5 arrests for:

1. A wanted subject which stemmed from a disturbance call.
2. An arrest of a subject wanted for kidnapping and first degree assault which resulted from a traffic stop.
3. The arrest of 3 suspects for attempted burglary. Officer Cross took the report and then made the decision to stay in the area covertly on the chance that the suspects returned to the location to attempt the burglary again. The suspects did, in fact, return to the area and were arrested after a one-on-one was conducted with a witness and they were positively identified.

At the end of the month Officer Cross made a traffic stop for a minor violation. The listed owner had an outstanding warrant and the driver could not positively be identified. Officer Cross went with the driver to his residence nearby to see proof of identity. Once inside, Officer Cross discovered several hundred vials of crack, 2 large bags of marijuana, a scale and \$291.00 in US currency.

## **September 2003 Officer Eric Cross**

Officer Eric Cross was chosen for the above award due to his continued high enforcement not only in traffic but criminal arrests as well.

The most significant arrest that Officer Cross made this month was of a wanted subject. Officer Cross responded to a call for service on Mindale Circle and saw a subject riding a bike who matched the description of the subject who ran from the police a few weeks earlier. He verified

that this was the same subject and that there was an active warrant for CDS violations. Officer Cross had the subject stopped and as he was questioning him, the subject began to become agitated and move around. Knowing that this subject liked to flee from police, Officer Cross made the decision to arrest the subject before backup arrived. As he was attempting to take the subject into custody, he pushed Officer Cross away from him so he could reach for a gun in his pants. Officer Cross saw this and grabbed the subject's hands. Both Officer Cross and the subject fell to the ground as they struggled for the handgun. The handgun fell to the ground not far from them. The subject continued to reach for the gun as he struggled with Officer Cross. Finally, Officer Cross was able to spray the subject with his O.C. spray, which enabled him to take the subject into custody. The handgun was recovered and found to be a .22 caliber loaded with several rounds. A ziplock baggie of marijuana was also recovered from the subject.

Officer Cross should be commended for his bravery and the extreme poise that he displayed in this very scary situation.
